DEAR COLLEAGUES

It's our immense pleasure and privilege to invite you to the **National Seminar on 'Women Empowerment and Inclusive Growth'** which is being held at The IIS University, Jaipur, on 13-14 March, 2015.

India's economy has experienced a gradual transformation since independence. The economic growth of India is the result of the contributions of the citizens, policy makers and the expansion plans adopted from time to time. When we talk of the contributions in the economic growth, the role of women cannot remain unobserved. As per the National Policy for the Empowerment of Women, the principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles. The Constitution not only guarantees equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures of positive discrimination in favour of women. Although various laws have been formulated for the empowerment of women in India, but we should not forget gender discrimination is so deep rooted in Indian society that mere formulation of rules and regulations would not serve the purpose. Building theoretical frameworks alone cannot fulfill the objective of women empowerment. There is a need of building women's capacity through training and non-formal education so that they are able to access and exterminate the root causes of both social and financial inequality in local communities. This would facilitate them to achieve self-reliance and sustainability. The present seminar has been planned to achieve the following objectives:

- To ignite the deliberations for bridging the gap between the regulations and the ground reality of the position of women in Indian society.
- To discuss the role of women in India's inclusive growth and how women empowerment can increase the velocity of inclusive growth, through capacity building.

The abstract should include the name of sub theme at the bottom of the page. The abstract should include a brief note about: Statement of problem, Methodology, Analysis & Findings. Paper presentation in the seminar will be permitted only when the participant has registered for the seminar and has submitted the full paper. No abstract will be taken into consideration for pre-seminar publication without registration fee. On spot papers will not be accepted.
