DEAR COLLEAGUES

It is our immense pleasure and privilege to invite you to the Interdisciplinary National Conference on 'Sustainable Rural Development in India: Efforts and Challenges' which is being held at The IIS University, SFS, Gurukul Marg, Jaipur, on 18-19 September, 2012.

India is an emerging economy of the world with three-fourths of the population residing in rural areas. Agriculture, being one of the major sources contributing to the GDP of the country, is a great source of livelihood for majority of people. The census data of 2011 clearly indicates that there is a large gap between need and availability of livelihood avenues in rural areas. The proportion of BPL population is again higher in rural areas. Thus the rural sector in India needs prioritized focus of planners to enhance rural economy on one hand and strengthen human resources on the other hand. Efforts have been made both by the central and the concerned state governments to improve the existing rural scenario. However, there is a wide gap between the existing goals and effective implementation. There are various issues which need to be addressed at various levels with the government and the civil society:

- (i) Is there a programme to transform rural population into rural human resource? People are being lured to cities with job offers for a short period with minimum wages, hardly sufficient for their survival.
- (ii) Whether an effective strategy to ensure sustainability of development oriented works has been outlined?
- (iii) How do we enlist the real beneficiaries? The tragedy with the needy people is that their existence is not even noticed by enlisting agencies, whereas those who are capable of maintaining their survival are being benefited in the name of the poor.

In a nutshell, there are a number of gaps in planning and implementation of rural welfare programmes. The scenario cannot be altered by the Government alone unless viable plans are laid down and their successful implementation is ensured through public support. There is a need to establish a sound public monitoring mechanism for the efficacy of such programmes.

India is a country with widespread regional diversities and hence the specificities of Sustainable Development are more peculiar and need intense attention of scholars. Therefore, the need to understand complexities of Sustainable Development, along with various challenges involved in this process, is essential for finally sketching out a road map for sustainable development. It is a process that has to be dealt with using an interdisciplinary approach and only then can a viable strategy be determined.
