Worked towards seeking approval for changing the nomenclature of "MBA-Entrepreneurship Development" to 'MBA-Entrepreneurship and Family Business Management" as per recommendation of the Academic Council.

Worked towards seeking approval was also accorded for reconstituting the Boards of Studies in different disciplines and the panels of external experts framed by the Academic Council for appointment of external experts on Boards of Studies were also approved by the Board of Management, with a proviso that two out of the panel of four external subject experts be appointed as members of Boards of Studies subject to availability and convenience. Approval was also accorded for appointing one industry expert and/or one alumna out of the panel on each Board of Studies, as member for a period of two years.

Finalizing the recommendation of the Academic Council for awarding 734 Certificates, 268 Diplomas and 31 Advance Diplomas to candidates qualifying such courses in different Career Oriented and Skill development programmes during the Academic Session was approved.

1. Administrative procedures including finance

Notices regarding academic events, co-curricular activities, etc are dispersed through the metacampus system, which is accessible to each student and staff member through a personal id. Similarly, the salary slip is also available to each staff member through the personalised metacampus id. The metacampus is planning to introduce a Human Resource Module as well as an Inventory module to facilitate administration processes, in the upcoming session.

2. Student admission

The prospectus, brochure, course, credits and evaluation information (Academic Handbook), fee structure, scholarship and freeship information, hostel information, are available on the university website. The admission process is initiated with the online application form. Next, the updated admission lists are

available online through our website. The student can access the same for latest updates of short listed candidates etc. Along with the fee receipt, the student is given a unique identity number and password allowing access to the metacampus, to the student as well as the ward, individually.

3. Student records

We maintain detailed student records. The attendance for each paper, course details, the marks list (proposed), important notices are all available on the student's metacampus id, for reference of the student/ward, individually. We also send regular attendance records of wards to parents, through the metacampus id. I tis proposed that forthwith, student attendance, marks list, important events and announcements shall also be forwarded to wards via SMS. Additionally, through the Bio-Metric Attendance System, the parent is notified, through SMS, about the entry and exit of their ward from the University campus.

The Mentor Guardian has access to detailed records of each ward, including parents profile, address, phone number etc. The Mid- Term Evaluation Record (Yellow Booklet) is another process wherein the student has access to the internal marking process, which entails marks for CA examinations, Project/Quiz, Attendance and Student Interaction. The above processes facilitate transparency within the system and keep the flow of information active.

4. Evaluation and examination procedures

The website constantly updates information regarding examination/viva dates. Moreover, information is also passed through the metacampus, wherein each student is given a personal notification of important notices. Moreover, it has been proposed that student evaluation marks will also be available on metacampus to enable the student to have a transparent picture of her internal marking quotient. It has been proposed that the student feedback on curriculum, metacampus, and faculty shall be available on metacampus for admin purposes. Parents can also send feedback, through the website, which will be integrated into the system.

5. Research administration

The metacampus feeds information to each personal id, about conferences, seminars, projects etc. In addition, the system maintains an elaborate research profile of each staff member which includes details of conferences attended, papers published, monographs, theses/ dissertations guided, areas of research, post doctoral details, amongst others. This data is available to the Research Promotion Committee so as to enable easy access and export of data under various heads of profile.

Moreover, for research scholars, PhD/M.Phil byelaws, list of approved supervisors, and summary of theses awarded are available on the website. It has been proposed that the Research Proposal Plan of each scholar will also be available online.

The University maintains a student feedback channel wherein the student response to each programme as well as each faculty member is maintained. This is useful for regular improvisation and improvement in the
